1. Type the name of the author into the first blank box (last name first) and change the type of search from "Default Fields" to "Author." (See example above.)
2. Type one or two of the most distinctive words from the title of the article into the second blank box, and change the type of search from "Default Fields" to "Title," as shown above.
3. Type the name of the publication in which the article was published into the box labeled "Journal Title" under **Limit Your Results**.
4. You may search using more elements of the citation, for example by including the year (above the "journal title" box), or you may search using fewer elements, for example by searching only by the author's name.
5. Click "Search."
6. Your results should include the citation for the article you seek. Follow the link to the full text.
